



SURVEY RESULTS

We surveyed 435 Hawaii drivers in July 2023 about the state of courtesy on our roads. Their top five complaints: Drivers who (1) signal late or not at all; (2) weave in and out of traffic; (3) tailgate; (4) don't allow others to merge; and (5) talk on their cell phone while driving. More survey highlights:



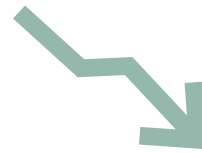
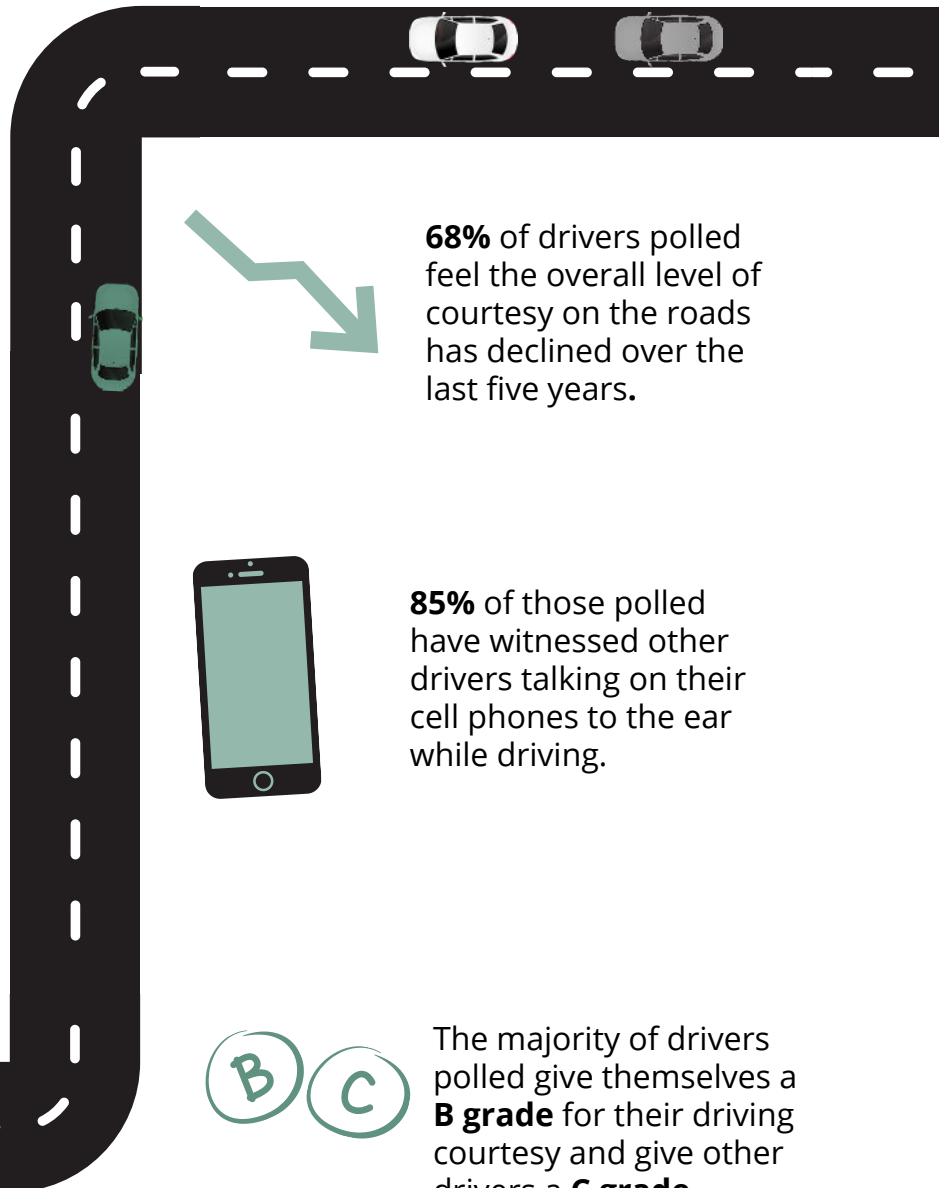
87% of those polled agree that driving courtesy is contagious.



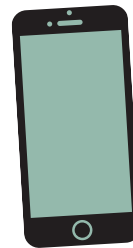
75% of those polled appreciate it when another driver acknowledges their courtesy on the road.



33% of drivers polled have witnessed other drivers getting out of their vehicles to confront others.



68% of drivers polled feel the overall level of courtesy on the roads has declined over the last five years.



85% of those polled have witnessed other drivers talking on their cell phones to the ear while driving.



The majority of drivers polled give themselves a **B grade** for their driving courtesy and give other drivers a **C grade**.
